


# **FEMALE FACTOR INFERTILITY**





## Assessment

History and physical examination	<ul> <li>History: medical history (including GYN and OB), sexual development, severe systemic illness or trauma, infections, surgical procedures, drugs and environmental toxins, sexual history, duration of infertility</li> <li>Physical: complete physical exam including pelvic exam;</li> </ul>
	assess for obesity, endocrine disorders, general health
Ultrasound of pelvis	To rule out structural issues
Endocrine testing	To assess estrogen, progesterone, LH, FSH, TSH, and additional labs as indicated
Hysterosalpin- gogram	To assess patency of tubes
Postcoital test	To evaluate if sperm are alive after being exposed to the vaginal environment
Hysteroscopy or laparoscopy	To rule out structural issues

### Definitions

Diagnosis of infertility is based on age and duration of inability to conceive.

< 35 years old = Inability to conceive after 12 months of unprotected intercourse > 35 years old = Inability to conceive after 6 months of unprotected intercourse

### **Primary infertility**

Inability to conceive or difficulty with conceiving in one who has never been pregnant

#### Secondary infertility

Inability to achieve or difficulty with achieving a pregnancy after having had a successful pregnancy
