ORAL CONTRACEPTIVE MANAGEMENT



Combined Oral Contraceptive (COC)

Active ingredient

Estrogen (ethinylestradiol, estradiol, mestranol) & progestin (levonorgestrel, norethindrone, norgestrel, etc) → many combinations

Placebo week



Mechanism of action	Estrogen: suppresses FSH, prevents follicle development Progestin: suppresses LH, prevents ovulation, thins uterine lining, thickens cervical mucus
Administra- tion	28-day pill pack typically includes 3 weeks of pills containing hormones and one week of placebo or iron pills. Period or "withdrawal bleed" occurs during placebo week, then client starts new pill pack. May also be taken on a 91-day cycle.
	Common side effects: Serious adverse effects:

tions and precautions **Contraindica**

Nausea, breast tenderness, headaches, weight gain, mood changes, decreased libido, irregular bleeding

Contraindications:

- Smoker > 35 years old
- Hx of blood clot
- Abnormal liver function
- Known breast cancer

Danger signs to report:

A: Abdominal pain (sharp)

- C: Chest pain (severe)
- H: Headache (severe)
- E: Eye/vision changes

S: Sharp leg pain

- Risk of blood clots → PE, MI, stroke
- Hypertension
- Rare hepatic adenoma

Precautions:


HTN, cardiac disease, diabetes, migraine, epilepsy, gallbladder disease, uterine fibroids, smoker < 35 years old

Drug-drug interactions

Advise clients that many medications interact with oral contraceptives. Consult provider if taking antibiotics, anxiolytic, anticonvulsants, antidepressants, or warfarin, among others.

Progestin-Only Pill (POP)

A single progestin (levonorgestrel, norethindrone, drospirenone)



Progestin:

suppresses LH, prevents ovulation, thins uterine lining, thickens cervical mucus

Continuous cycling:

28-day pill pack includes all hormone-containing pills and no placebo. New pill pack is started as soon as previous pack is completed.

Common side effects: Lower risk of blood Nausea, headaches, breast tenderness, acne, mood changes, libido changes

- clots
- Higher likelihood of irregular bleeding

Contraindications:

- Known breast cancer
- Unexplained abnormal vaginal bleeding

Precautions:

- Epilepsy
- Hx bariatric surgery
- Abnormal liver function

Initiation

Quick start (preferred): Start any day of cycle, use back pills and when to use up x 7 days (may also initiate day 1 or Sunday after 1st day of period).

Missed pills

Teach clients what to do in case of missed a back-up method.
