
OTITIS MEDIA



Otitis media is the inflammation or infection (viral or bacterial) of the middle ear. It affects 10% of people globally annually and 50% of these cases occur in children.



Eustachian tube	Infants	Adults
Length	Approx. 9 mm	Approx. 18 mm
Direction of drainage into throat	Horizontal	More vertical, assisted by gravity



Causes

- Bacterial or viral infection
- Allergic reaction
- More common in infants and children because of their weaker immune system and developing bodies

Risk factors

- Exposure to
 - Secondhand smoke
 - Allergens
 - · Large groups of people
- Pacifier use
- Craniofacial abnormalities

Symptoms in children

- Irritability
- · Tugging at the ear
- Loss of balance
- Fever
- Otalgia (ear pain)
- Difficulty hearing

Symptoms in adults

- Irritability
- Fatigue
- Loss of balance
- Fever
- Otalgia (ear pain)
- Difficulty hearing

OTC analgesics (NSAIDs or acetaminophen)

Treatments

- Antibiotics if caused by a bacterial infection
- Decongestants
- Antihistamines
- Tympan ostomy tubes for recurrent cases
- Rest

Complications include:

Perforation of the tympanic membrane



Speech or hearing delays or challenges



Mastoiditis: infection of the mastoid space behind the ear



Rarely: brain infections
