Definition	Viral or bacterial inflammation of the throat mucosa	Viral or bacterial inflammation of the tonsils	A bacterial infection of the throat caused by streptococcal bacteria
Signs and symptoms	<ul><li>Dry, scratchy throat</li><li>May have enlarged lymph nodes</li><li>Throat pain</li></ul>	<ul><li>Enlarged tonsils</li><li>White patches on tonsils</li><li>Foul breath</li><li>Throat pain</li></ul>	<ul><li>Tiny red spots on the roof of the mouth</li><li>Absence of cough</li><li>Fever</li><li>Throat pain</li></ul>
Management options	<ul> <li>OTC pain analgesics (NSAIDs, acetaminophen)</li> <li>Throat lozenges</li> <li>Salt water gargles</li> <li>Depending on cause, tonsillitis may need antibiotic therapy.</li> <li>Strep throat always requires antibiotic therapy.</li> </ul>		
Possible complications	<ul> <li>Dehydration</li> <li>Chronic throat pain</li> <li>Ear infections</li> <li>Pharyngitis often precedes other viral infections and if symptoms persist, needs to be evaluated for viral or other bacterial illness.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Sleep apnea (if severely swollen tonsils)</li> <li>Ear infections or peritonsillar abscess</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Rheumatic fever</li> <li>Otitis media</li> <li>Kidney infection</li> <li>Pneumonia</li> <li>Toxic shock syndrome</li> <li>Meningitis</li> </ul>
