# **REMOVAL OF SKIN STAPLES POSTOPERATIVELY**



## **Supplies**



Sterile staple removal kit



Gauze



Normal saline




Adhesive strips

### **Pre-Procedure**

- Perform hand hygiene.
- Provide privacy.
- Explain procedure to client and assess pain level.
- Raise bed to an appropriate height.
- Assist client into proper position.



If signs of infection or dehiscence are present, stop and contact provider prior to proceeding.



#### Skin Assessment

- Assess incision site for signs of infection: redness, warmth, swelling, discharge, drainage.
- Assess incision site for dehiscence.

#### **Procedure**

- 1. Perform hand hygiene and put on gloves.
- 2. Remove wound dressing if present.
- 3. Assess the incision site.
- 4. If wound dressing was soiled, discard gloves, perform hand hygiene and put on new gloves before proceeding.
- 5. Open sterile staple removal kit.
- 6. Cleanse the incision site using gauze and normal saline.
- 7. Place the bottom of the staple remover under the center of first staple.
- 8. Keep staple remover stable against skin and compress the handle. The staple ends will pull up and out of the incision.

- 9. Lift the staple out of skin. Release pressure on handle to release staple into appropriate disposal unit.
- 10. Repeat removal of staples, in order, until complete (or as directed).
- 11. Apply adhesive strips if needed.
- 12. Apply dressing if ordered.
- 13. Dispose of supplies, remove gloves, and perform hand hygiene.
- 14. Assess client's comfort.
- Provide aftercare instructions.
- 16. Document the procedure.









#### **CLINICAL TIP:**

Don't lift the staple remover while squeezing the handle. Wait until ends of staple have popped up and out of the skin.
