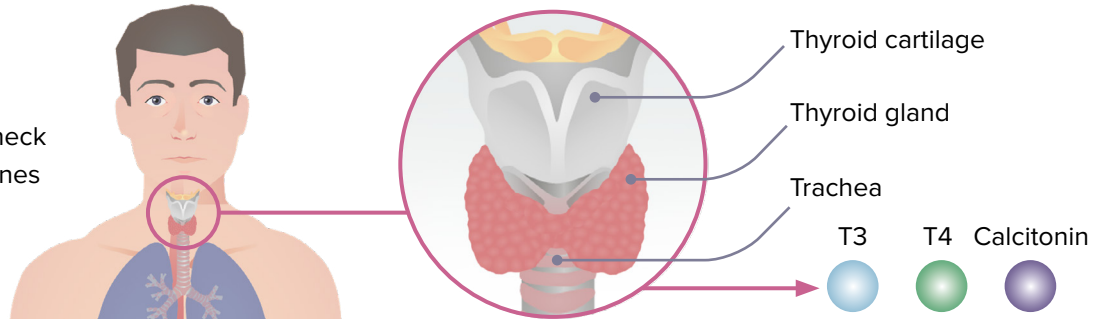


THE THYROID: FUNCTION AND DISORDERS



The thyroid is a butterfly-shaped hormone gland in the front of the neck that produces and releases hormones which regulate body metabolism, growth and development.



T3 (Thyroxine) and T4 (Triiodothyronine) Regulate:

- Body temperature
- Pulse
- Heartbeat
- Reflexes/activation of the nervous system
- Basal metabolic rate
- Brain maturation (in children)
- Growth (in children)
- Calcitonin → decreasing Ca-levels in the bloodstream

LEARNING TIP:

Iodine is one of the main building blocks of T3 and T4. It is obtained from a diet that includes fish, dairy, eggs, or supplements such as iodized salt.

Common Disorders of the Thyroid

Graves' disease

Autoimmune disorder that attacks the thyroid gland, causing an overproduction of thyroid hormones

Hashimoto's thyroiditis

Autoimmune disorder involving chronic inflammation of the thyroid causing gradual decline in thyroid function leading to hypothyroidism

Thyroid storm

Life-threatening medical emergency due to extreme fever and heart issues, caused by high levels of thyroid hormone and low levels of thyroid-stimulating hormone (TSH) in the blood

Goiters

- An overall enlargement of the thyroid, or it may be the result of irregular cell growth that forms one or more lumps (nodules) in the thyroid
- Goiters may cause an increase or decrease in hormones produced.
